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Online Safety – 'Wake Up Wednesday'



'Internet Safety Parent Workshop'

On Tuesday afternoon, 3rd December, we had a fantastic session delivered by Jon Galling (DCC Strategic Lead for Safeguarding and Vulnerable Groups) on keeping our children safe online. Everyone who attended felt they had learned something new and valuable. I will share some of the resources and tips via the next few Willand Words so watch this space ...Some of the key things we learned were.

- 1.Play online games alongside your children so that they know you are interested and will talk to you. This is the key to keeping them safe. If they don't feel that you understand 'their world', they are less likely to share their worries.
- 2. There were some quite shocking statistics about how children can be targeted online. It's important to be aware and not assume that it won't happen to your child. We do teach online safety as part of our curriculum, but children spend far more time online at home than in school so it's important for parents to keep up-to-date too.
- 3. You can filter the internet before it even enters your home via WiFi. Use this link today to check whether yours is switched on or not. https://swqfl.org.uk/services/test-filtering/ If not, contact your service provider to have filtering switched on. It's FREE!

Jon talked about using seatbelts in the car for safety. Things such as internet filters and age restrictions are like the seatbelts in our cars; we wouldn't drive our children around without them so we shouldn't allow them internet access without the 'virtual seatbelts'.


Wellington Maths Challenge
