

Dear Parents


We promised to share with you some of the really useful information that Jon Galling, Strategic Lead for Safeguarding and Vulnerable Groups, shared with us at his fantastic workshop on Tuesday 3rd December.

One resource was the Dove foundation (yes, the company that makes soap!). https://www.dove.com/us/en/campaigns/purpose/kidsonline-safety.html

They have produced some videos that will help parents to understand the potential harm that some aspects of social media can cause. Social media is a great resource which you are probably using yourself and your children may be starting to use. It can also be a source of pressure to look or behave in a certain way, and it's really important to discuss these pressures with your children. You may think you are already aware, but take a few minutes to look at the website and it may give you a starting point for opening up that discussion.

If you are affected by any of the issues, please do not hesitate to contact us to discuss. We suggest that this website is for adults to use and then to discuss with your child as you see fit. One of the key messages that Jon gave us is the vital role that parents play in protecting your children from harm online.
